





# Headteacher's Message

As I write this message on a fine sunny Manchester day, I want to take this opportunity to thank all the parents who attended the Headteacher forum last week. I appreciate the time you gave up listening to me, and your insight into how we can improve the school has been taken onboard. I would like to run more of these type events in the future and it is encouraging to see how many of you want to help.

I would like to acknowledge the hard work and commitment of many of our students both last week and this week and the encouraging way in which they have responded to our higher expectations. New systems and structures always take time to embed but I would like to acknowledge that around 95% of the student population meet our expectations every time, without any reminders. The remaining 5% still have some way to go to adjust to the new expectations but we are seeing this minority number reduce over time.

It is important that I express my sincere appreciation for your efforts in ensuring that your child maintains a high standard of uniform at school. We have noticed a significant improvement in the uniform standards across the school, and we believe that your efforts have played a crucial role in achieving this improvement. Uniforms play an essential role in creating a sense of unity and discipline among students. It also helps students to develop a sense of pride in themselves and in belonging to the St Matthew's family. It is heartening to see that so many children have embraced these values and are taking ownership of their appearance and conduct in school.

Next week we will be holding year group assemblies to reflect on the pride we should show in our uniform. It is our belief that a uniform is not only a reflection of the school's values but also a representation of the student body. Therefore, we appreciate your support in maintaining the high standards we have set for our students. With this in mind, may I give you advanced warning that we will expect all children to attend school in September 2023 with the full school uniform including the correct shoes. I know it's likely that uniform will be purchased in the summer holidays, and I want to avoid any families making purchases that don't adhere to school policy. Further guidelines about this will be sent out in due course but I would like to give you as much notice as possible.

Finally, I would like to thank all the students who attend after school activities and those who freely give up their time to help and support younger students. This is reflective of our Catholic values and it makes me proud to lead this school. I hope you enjoy another long weekend and are able to spend some relaxing family time together.

- 73% of students with attendance of 95% or higher, achieve at least 5 GCSEs grade 5 or above
- Only 35% of students with attendance of between 80-90% manage to achieve 5 GCSEs grade 5 or above
- Research shows that students with 5 GCSEs grade 5 or above earn on average £350,000 more in their lifetime than those without grades
- Excellent attendance at school = 97% and above
